Target Business Sectors:

- **Singapore:** Water treatment and waste water recycling systems, filtering and purifying machinery, desalination plants, rainfall storage, and extension of tunnels for water collection;
- **Vietnam:** Water Control & Monitoring equipment, filtration systems, waste stabilization ponds, activated sludge, large waste water pumps and water treatment chemicals;
- **Philippines:** drinking & potable water treatment equipment & processes, water supply systems, products and equipment for water supply rehabilitation and the construction and development of water supply sources, and sewage products and equipment.

Why South East Asia?

- The Asian Development Bank is focusing on innovation and investment in the water sector – financing for global water security.
- Singapore has numerous major water projects (NEWater (recycle water), the Deep Tunnel Sewage Systems, and desalination and rainfall storage at the Marina Barrage.
- The lack of clean water is one of Vietnam’s most pressing environmental concerns. The Government of Vietnam is using funding from the World Bank and the Agence Francaise de Development to develop water distribution networks.
- The Philippine market for water resource equipment and services is expected to grow by at least 5 percent yearly, due to the current and upcoming projects.
