Strong Transportation & Logistics Focus. Turkey is the 17th largest economy in the world and has a population of over 75 million. Turkey's transportation and logistics sector is one of the fastest growing industries, as it has tripled in value since 2002, with an average growth rate of 20% over the last five years.

Major Push for New Transportation Projects. By 2023, Turkey has set a target to reach full completion of the privatization of railroads, as well as the connection of marine ports and railroads. Within aviation, the number of domestic and international flights has greatly increased, leading to a significant increase in total passenger and cargo traffic and the investment in new airport projects.

Opportunities for New Technologies in Roads, Rail, Marine & Air.
